A MESSAGE FROM The Bli Bli Community Association

Our Winter edition of the Bulletin includes a few new additions with the Maroochy River Golf Club giving us an update as well as advertising the club. We have profiled Tony Bitz the local barber which makes for an interesting read and our much travelled Wetlands contributor Deb is back and has provided us with news from the Wetlands. With the new business centre nearing completion a few new businesses have also advertised in preparation for the opening which will be very exciting. So no doubt our Spring edition of the Bulletin will be full of stories around the new businesses.

At the May Community Association meeting held on Tuesday 15th, we invited Inspector Mike Miley along to address those gathered about crime in our area which had been doing the rounds on social media. Insp Miley reported that 72% of the reported offences were crime related and they were mainly due to people leaving their cars unlocked. He reminded everyone that they must ensure they lock their cars and houses. Most of the offenders were in the 16-24 age group and they were coming up from down south and stealing the cars and taking them to Beerwah State Forest. Although there had been a spike in the past few weeks, Bli Bli was no worse than any other area on the Coast as some on social media would have us believe. At the meeting Cr Steve Robinson also provided us with an update from Council, John Tucker reported about the Wetlands, Nigel Kemp about the Rural Fire Brigade, Claire Stampa from the school and Max Perren regarding the Historical Society. So plenty of information about what is happening and is to happen in our local area.

It is getting to that time of the year for cane crushing to begin. So you should be aware of the B Double trucks that will start to appear on our roads carting cane to the Maryborough Mill and the cane fires which will appear on dusk. This process has been going on for many years and on a clear Sunday evening makes for a great spectacle.

The Community Association is bringing to our community two great events over the next 2 months. On Friday 29 June is the drive in movie night to be held on the school oval and on Saturday 28 July is the popular BOB night for the boys. So make sure you keep these nights free.

The President of the Community Association Chris Baker recently presented to the Principal of the school Mr Quinn and chappy Heather Baker (no relation) and the school captains a cheque for \$10,000 from monies raised from the annual Christmas Carols.

Finally, if anyone is looking for some exercise especially in the Parklakes 2 area then we are looking for a couple more volunteers to help us deliver the Bulletin and we would welcome you contacting us.

EXPLORE INDIGENOUS GAMES AT MULLER PARK

As part of the 2018 Commonwealth Games event council, in partnership with the Queensland Government, Nature Play Queensland and the Office of the Commonwealth Games, installed a traditional indigenous games trail in Bli Bli's Muller Park. I encourage you to explore the trail to find out about traditional games that were played by indigenous children in many different parts of Australia. Muller Park is a very fitting location for this games trail given its indigenous history. The trail also ties in beautifully with the unique indigenous-inspired playground at the park. You can find details about all the games, including instructional videos, on council's website.

The new picnic shelters at Muller Park are also now complete, so why not pack a picnic and take a look at the games trail before lunch?

BLI BLI COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION MEETING

The May meeting was well attended with a presentation from officers of the Queensland Police Service on some of the local police issues in Bli Bli. While the clear message was that Bli Bli remains a safe neighbourhood, it was a timely reminder to make sure your home and vehicle are always locked and secure.

AIRPORT EXPANSION MILESTONE

I recently attended the sod turning ceremony for the Sunshine Coast Airport Expansion Project and I am really pleased to see this project officially underway with the contractor, John Holland Group. The new runway will be completed by Christmas 2020.

Initial work includes start-up activities for the dredging and dunal works. Beach Access 111 and its associated parking will be closed until dredging works are complete at the end of October 2018. Signs have been installed to direct pathways users to other accesses and traffic management will be in place for David Low Way. Thanks for your patience while this work is completed.

MEET AND GREET

At my last meet and greet session at the River Markets, the key issues raised by residents included the completion date for the Lefoes Road/Willis Road intersection (a Transport and Main Roads project); trucks, signage and the condition of McDonalds Road; and progress on the old Quirky Circle site. The latest advice I have on the intersection is that the works should be completed by mid-June. I'll keep you updated on each of the other issues as they move along.

IT IS WONDERFUL TO BE PART OF SUCH A GREAT COMMUNITY HERE IN BLI BLI. WITH PLENTY OF EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES EVERY MONTH, THERE IS ALWAYS SOMETHING TO DO, AND I'VE CERTAINLY BEEN ENJOYING THE OPPORTUNITY TO SUPPORT A NUMBER OF LOCAL CAUSES.

One of the highlights was the Anzac Day ceremonies, when I joined with residents, community representatives and federal and local government colleagues to honour our servicemen and women at a moving service at Bli Bli Edgewater. This was one of a number of local services I had the privilege of being part of this year, and I was impressed to see such a huge turnout commemorating our proud Anzac legacy.

The last time I rode a skateboard it didn't end well, so I donned my sneakers instead to join the students at Bli Bli State School for the annual Walk to School Day recently. It was great to see so many students and their families swap their usual mode of transport and hit the pavement. A special thanks to the School P&C for organising the event, including breakfast when we arrived at school!

The following week, I returned to the school to be part of the Biggest Morning Tea event, raising money for the Queensland Cancer Council. Again, a great effort and result with plenty of yummy sweet treats on offer, thanks to the wonderful donations by local families.

I would also like to say a big thank you to all those who volunteered their time to help make the second annual Bli Bli Skate Comp such a huge success. Special mention must be made of the Bli Bli Neighbourhood Watch, and our local area coordinator Edith Blanck. Without her persistence, dedication and tireless efforts, community events like this would simply not happen. To all the members who volunteer their time, thank you for your support.

STATE BUDGET UPDATE

With the State Budget due to be handed down mid-June, there is increasing pressure on the State Labor Government to deliver on major road and rail infrastructure funding for our region.

While I have been fighting for local projects such as the upgrade of the Coolool roundabout, and the replacement of the single lane Caboolture Creek Bridge, I used the last sitting of Parliament to ask the Transport Minister if the State Government will fund it's share to commence the upgrade of the Bruce Highway between Caloundra Road and Pine Rivers, following the Federal Government's funding commitment of \$880million.

Similarly, following the Federal Government's \$390million commitment for the duplication of the north coast rail line, I've also asked the Minister to confirm whether funds will be allocated in this budget to ensure this essential work gets underway.

GAMBLING COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND

A shout out to those local groups who've received grant funding from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund, including the Bli Bli Community Association and the Maroochy River Rowing Club. This year alone, local clubs have received more than \$160,000 in funding support, so make sure you log on to the grants portal at www.gamblingcommunitybenefitfund.qld.gov.au to apply for the next round.

GRAB A REUSEABLE BAG

It's great to see local businesses have really thrown their support behind the call to ban plastic shopping bags. From 1 July, retailers will no longer be able to supply single use plastic bags, and consumers are encouraged to use their own.

If you haven't already got yours, I'll be handing out some free, reusable bags at my next Listening Post outside White's IGA on Monday 4 June, from 4pm-6pm. If you miss out, give me a call on 5406 7900 or email ninderry@parliament.qld.gov.au.

Character

We foster the development of valuable members of society who demonstrate integrity, confidence and resilience.

Last year I wrote about the explicit ways that **CHARACTER** can be developed in the individual and how we go about this important task at Bli Bli State School, and also how elusive this concept can be to develop. We also strive to develop this trait at a school level not only to create a context for our students, staff and families, but also as a benchmark for our entire community.

How might you see evidence of this on a community, school and individual level?

As a school, our recent ANZAC Day ceremonies are a great example of how our students, staff and community quietly commemorate and learn to aspire to the best aspects of the Australian values and character - integrity, honour, mateship, resilience and reliability. At Bli Bli State School, every student attends at least one ceremony and many participate through marching, singing and laying wreaths. Our school social framework and *Positive Behaviour for Learning* program helps develop these characteristics, which in turn encourage lifelong happiness and success.

At an individual level the mere fact that we do not always attain our goals initially helps develop resilience and character. We encourage our students to set goals - the next reading level; to be a school leader; nominate for, practicing and performing in choir or a sports team - every day, in class and in the playground, in academic and social learning. You will be aware that a number of Bli Bli State School students have raised money for cancer research, self-initiated and fostered by the school as they develop their character and input into the community.

What I often observe are the many ways that our students practice aspects of their developing characters in quiet times, when nobody is looking. When they learn most is during the testing times when the path forward is not so clear. Fortunately there are many excellent role models and significant people in their lives that they can observe and discuss with the next step, giving them the confidence to have a go and thus, building their resilience muscle memory.

I am increasingly impressed in our students' ability to demonstrate their character in a wide variety of contexts at school, at home and in the wider community. Thank you for supporting Bli Bli State School to develop our young people's characters for life by giving them opportunities to practice being the best version of themselves.

FOUNDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE

Many of you would agree with Steve Maraboli* when he says, 'What we instil in our children will be the foundation upon which they build their future.'

I certainly do and as the Behaviour Support Coach to the dedicated team at Bli Bli State School, I see evidence that they do too. Every day through all our purposeful and incidental interactions with students, we commit to nurturing the development of each in student's confidence, integrity, and resilience so that they will become valuable members of our society. Through our explicit lessons addressing skill development in building relationships that are respectful we actively teach, model and reinforce relationships where people feel safe, valued and accepted. In doing so we have calm welcoming classrooms at Bli Bli where students can focus on their learning and grow.

Of course, people being people, there are times when we need to address issues of relationship breakdown. Rude or mean words and actions, friendship conflict and bullying or harassment are approached restoratively with a focus on repairing the relationship and development strategies to prevent the situation occurring again. We guide students to be responsible for their own behaviour and away from blaming others for the situation they find themselves in. We problem solve and counsel students in their options to make things right and assist them developing pro-social skills for the future. The mistakes we make are learning opportunities, it's not the mistake you make it's how you fix it.

Working together with our parents, we are proud of the respectful and welcoming 'feel' Bli Bli State School has. It has not happened by accident, it is purposeful on-going initiative of our school community and our commitment to investing in our children's futures.

DON'T LET WINTER EQUAL PAIN FOR YOUR PET

WE WANT OUR PETS TO LIVE TO A RIPE OLD AGE, BUT MORE IMPORTANTLY WE WANT THEM TO BE ABLE TO ENJOY THEIR LIVES.

With the approaching cooler weather, it's a good time to assess whether your pet is showing signs of degenerative joint disease or osteoarthritis. Signs of chronic discomfort are subtle and can come on so gradually that you may not have noticed the changes.

An uncomfortable, arthritic pet may be reluctant to run as fast or as far as they once did. They may sleep more, take longer to lay down or get up, be grumpier, and not wish to play games they used to love.

If you notice any of these symptoms in your pet, don't be tempted to give your pet over-the-counter human pain medicines - some can be quite toxic. Make an appointment with your Veterinarian. It may be something more serious than arthritis, or it might be a temporary muscle ache that will heal in time. People are often amazed at how youthful their older pets become once their discomfort is relieved.

Unfortunately, arthritis is not always preventable; inherited conditions, aging, and inbred traits can all lead to arthritis later in life, regardless of care. A healthy diet, joint supplements containing glucosamine, chondroitin and Omega-3 fatty acids and personalised, treatment plans will slow or reduce the impact.

But there are also plenty of things you can do at home to improve your pet's comfort level and quality of life:

If rising and walking are difficult or painful: Lay out area rugs and carpet runners.

- Add non-slip stair treads to hardwood staircases.
- Pet socks/booties also do a great job of decreasing the slip if your dog will tolerate them.
- Trim the fur under your pet's paws to improve their grip.
- Keep your pet's nails trimmed. Reduced activity can lead to longer nails which force your pet's paws into an unnatural angle and increase pain.

If getting in and out of the car, or on and off furniture is a problem:

- Carry a ramp with you in the car.
- Position a set of pet-steps to the bed or couch.
- Use a comfortably fitted harness with lifting handle. It will save your back.

Try to remove the need for your pet to use stairs by having their food, water, bedding and toys all on the same level of the house.

When dogs get excited they may forget about the pain and overdo it at the park. Keep your dog as active as possible but adjust their routine. When you notice them start to slow or favour a leg, playtime is over for the day.

- Throw the ball shorter distances.
- Jog instead of run on your daily outing; or walk instead of jog!
- Take a few short walks, instead of one long one.
- Consider low impact exercise like swimming instead.
- Don't allow your dog to jump or stand on their hind legs.

Keep your pet's weight under control. Extra weight puts extra pressure on joints. One of the most cost-effective and beneficial ways to reduce the pain associated with arthritis is to maintain your pet at a healthy weight.

- Encourage your pet to be active and exercise more.
- Speak to your Vet Nurses about effective weight reduction diets.

If your pet suffers from neck or back pain, reduce the need to bend down by placing water and food bowls on a raised feeder stand.

Make sure your pets bedding is soft - to cushion their joints and away from drafts. Raising the bed a few inches off a cold floor will help keep them warmer and alleviate arthritis pain.

Heat increases circulation, stimulates muscles, and lessens pain. Many arthritic dogs appreciate having their muscles massaged - this stimulates blood flow to atrophying muscles. Additionally, warm compresses over sore joints can be soothing, but take care they are not too hot. You can also purchase heated pads for dog beds that are waterproof and have chew-resistant cords.

BLI BLI BUSINESS PROFILE

BULLETIN: WHERE DID YOU GROW UP?

I was born and lived in Innisfail North Queensland until about the age of 13 years when the family moved to Sydney. I started my apprenticeship at the age of 12 years at Galotti's Barber Shop in Innisfail. I started work in the shop half way through year 8 after school and Saturday mornings. When we moved to Sydney i was lucky enough to get a job in relations Barber Shop which had 6 chairs which exposed me to different cutting styles. I later went on to Tech College at Ultimo in Sydney.

BULLETIN: WHAT WAS IT LIKE WORKING IN THOSE DAYS?

My first year wage was equivalent to \$1 per week and I used to supplement that by going to the hospital after work on Saturdays to do haircuts for the patients for whatever they would pay which was usually around 10 cents. The business I used to work for would send me on errands (due to my age and innocence) that were embarrassing to me but after a while I woke up to their sense of humour. In those days almost everyone smoked including the barber. At the end of the day's work I would ride my Dad's pushbike 8 kms home often in the North Qld rain, which was no fun. When we moved to Sydney the Italian

customers would tip the young apprentice to give them the desire to do well as most of them came from poor backgrounds and they themselves required 'Manja' (tips) to be incentivised.

BULLETIN: HAVE YOU ALWAYS CUT MEN'S HAIR

No, about half way through my first year at Tech College I started cutting ladies hair because I was the only male in a class of 20 girls, but it didn't last long as they came from all different directions and it was hard work dating them! I eventually ended up working for Joe Bardetta in Kings Cross which was a pretty famous salon in its day. Joe had 4 salons and I worked at Kings Cross and also managed the Woolloomooloo salon which was a very busy 3 chair salon near Garden Island Navy Base.

BULLETIN: HAVE YOU CUT ANY CELEBRITIES HAIR?

Yes, Bardettas was a legendary salon in its time – being the salon of choice of the stars of the day with the likes of Frank Sinatra, John Laws, Tony Barber, Nat King Cole, Barry Croker and Charlton Heston to name just a few. In those days the majority of barbering was done with scissors and a razor which was invaluable in my hairdressing experience. Sadly Joe Bardetta

passed away in 2014 and his salons are not what they were back in the day. After work we would go to 'No Name' a famous eating house at the Cross and talk about work and life over spaghetti and a glass of wine.

BULLETIN: SO WHY SET UP A NEW SALON IN BLI BLI?

Over the years I have owned and operated 6 different Barber Shops and bring that experience into my new salon at Bli Bli which may possibly be my last. I love what I do and thoroughly enjoy the comradery I have with my clients and hopefully they are experiencing excellent service and value for money. WHAT'S ON IN THE WETLANDS

It's time to dust off those walking shoes and come on down to the Maroochy Wetlands Sanctuary to enjoy this beautiful winter walking weather.

The birds are calling, the crabs are creeping and the mozzies are sleeping!

So, get out and enjoy nature, just like some members of the U3A Birding Group who visited recently. They were quite excited to spot the Shining Flycatcher, which is not common in this area, plus confirmed sightings of the Varied Triller, Stilts, the Lewin's Honeyeater, Ibis and the Brown Cuckoo-dove to name a few.

Along with birds, there are many other creatures that make the wetlands their home. We are past the peak time for adults of this species but one of our volunteers, Robyn, found a lovely Brown Bunyip cicada.

Butterflies also abound, however some days there are plenty, whilst on others there are far fewer. The Leafwing Butterfly is one that was seen down the track recently.

Down near the river, various crab species are out and about, including the red-fingered marsh crabs, Purple and Cream Shore Crabs and Orange-clawed Fiddler Crabs. Spend some quiet time watching them busily going about their everyday business.

Also take the time to watch the antics of the mudskippers as they peck tiny aquatic insects from the mud and skim across the water.

The Visitor Information Centre is open most week days, and a volunteer is on duty most Sundays to tell you about the sanctuary and answer any questions you may have, so call in and have a chat.

The Volunteer Support Group meets at 7pm, at the sanctuary, on the second Thursday of every second month. All members, visitors and interested parties are very welcome to attend and the dates of the next few meetings are listed below. So, all that is left to say is...

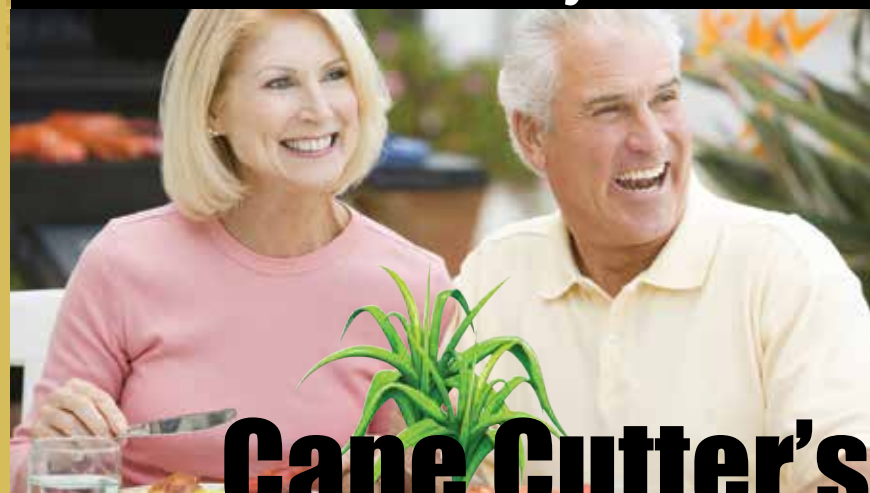

PROUD HERITAGE RUNS THROUGH SCHOOL AND DISTRICT

The first day of Prep at Bli Bli State School on the 22nd January wasn't just another milestone for Regina Catalano, it was also a special connection to her families past. Her late grandfather Lex Mackay and the older Mackay siblings attended Bli Bli School in the 1940s before being sent to Diddillibah School. That was closer to their farm and meant not having to cross the creek to attend. The following Nambour Chronicle article from 1943 acknowledges them and many other local Bli Bli families names, whom we recognise today through their living descendants, stories and even street names.

Regina's forbears rich history included the growing of sugar cane for over 50 years just on Petrie Creek and has been honoured by the naming of the Colin Dalzell Mackay Bridge at Diddillibah (her great grandfather) in 2016. Her great grandmother was also a Regina but known as Mary, whom spent a lot of her life fundraising for local charities and supporting the Bli Bli community hall and church. Mary was instrumental in the build of the first service station, now running as the Puma.

The old school masters residence, in which parents drive past every school day, was built by Regina's Great great uncle Alfred Dalzell (with John Whitecross in 1920) which is currently home to the local Historical group.

The Bli Bli School has a strong community bond and with its significant history and continues to grow from strength to strength.

NEPTUNES CELEBRATE NINETY YEARS OF LADIES LIFESAVING SERVICE (1928-2018)

Did you know that one of our local Bli Bli ladies was a founding member of the famous Neptunes Ladies Lifesaving Club established in 1928? Her name is Mrs. Victor Suosaari or Dorrie Suosaari (nee Cooper).

In early April 1928, the Easter weather proved to be sunny and warm. All of the favourite coastal camping spots, holiday flats and guesthouses were fully booked. Maroochydhore, Cotton Tree, Alexandra Headlands and Mooloolaba were packed with happy groups of families, friends and their city and country guests. Large crowds stood in front of the Club Hotel at Maroochydhore to witness the fine feats and daring displays of men's and women's lifesaving, diving and swimming. The sparkling waters of the Maroochy River was a major drawcard for locals, tourists, amateur swimmers and lifesavers.

During the 1928 Easter holidays, the aquatic carnival was a feature attraction for locals and visitors alike. The Suosaari brothers, Joe and Axel gave an impromptu display of their aquatic skills with the help of several ladies from the Neptune Ladies Lifesaving Club and later in the afternoon, men competed in a handicap swim, racing halfway across the Maroochy River and back. The large crowd also donated 8 pounds towards the purchase of a new surf boat. At the 1928 Easter carnival, the young lady Neptunes were: Misses Jean McGregor-Lowndes, Dorrie Cooper, Phyllis Fraser, Nancy Holmes and Lily Venning.

A young Miss Cooper came to know Bli Bli's Suosaari brothers through swimming competitions and from travelling together in the Queensland team, which toured North Queensland in 1925. Dorrie enjoyed competing in the swimming and diving events. When the opportunity came to learn lifesaving land drills and surf skills, Dorrie was one of the first ladies in Queensland to gain her Royal Life Saving award certificate in the late 1920s. Lifesaving was initially viewed as a male activity, as the men could swim out with line and reel to rescue and support people in swimming difficulties in the rivers or the surf.

Ladies lifesaving blossomed in Brisbane during the late 1920s and through the 1930's. On the North Coast two ladies' lifesaving teams formed at Mooloolaba in 1924 and at Alexandra Headlands in 1928. Those men and women competing in the local and regional swimming competitions formed the backbone of the Coast's lifesaving movement.

The first ever Queensland ladies' lifesaving competition was held at Mooloolaba on the Easter holidays of 1929. The event was possibly the first event of its kind in Australia. The Neptune team captured the inaugural title and the silver cup, winning 173 2/3 points to Alexandra Headlands team with 162 5/6 points.

The Neptunes' success lies in its creed of dedicated selfless service to the community. The Neptunes community values and their water safety ideals continue to be relevant in 2018.
