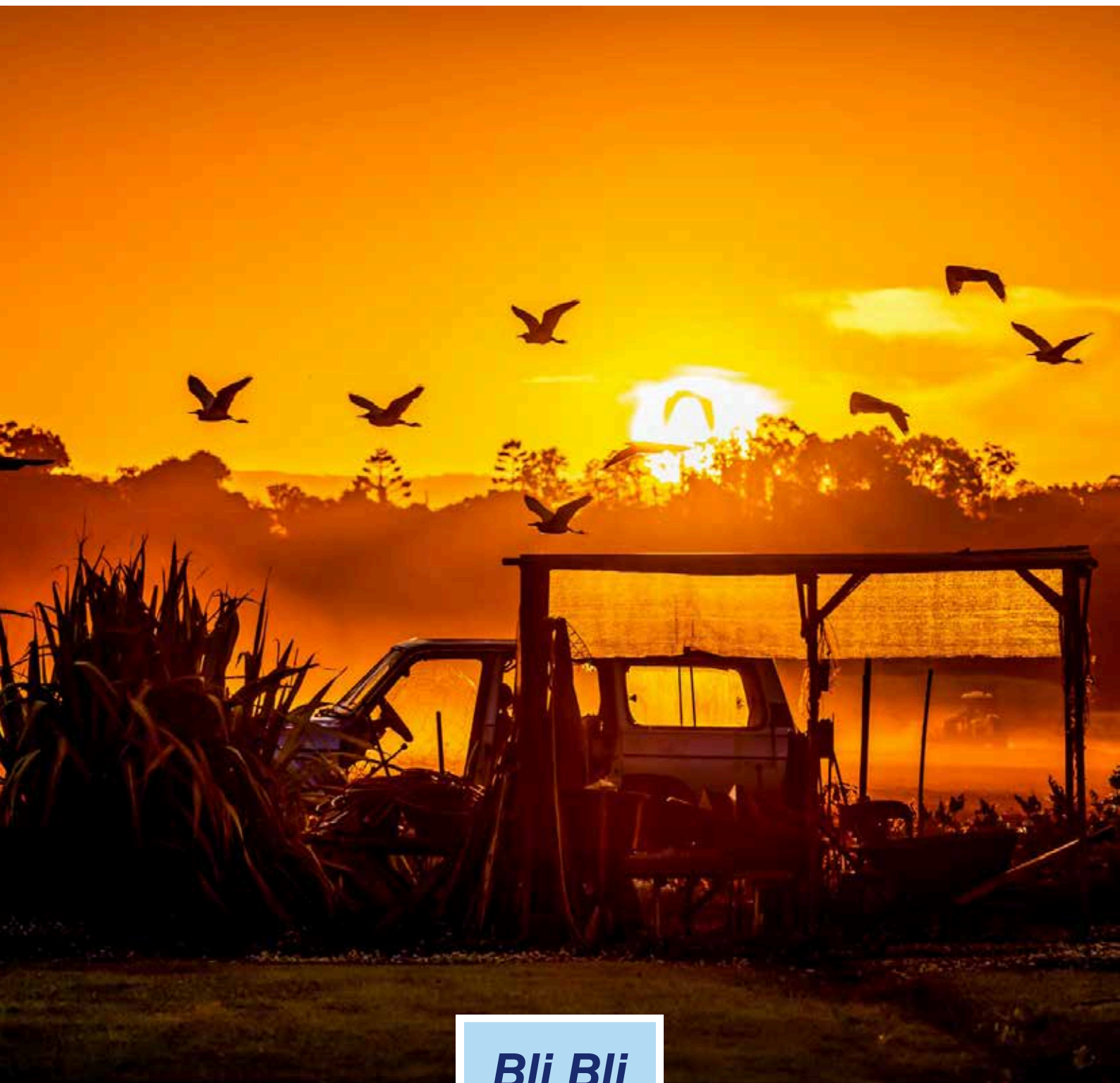

This edition of the Bulletin includes details in respect to some exciting new events in our local community. For many of you the name Karen Simpson will be familiar as she is regularly posting wonderful photos of our area on facebook. For quite a while now we have been using her photos on the front page of the Bulletin. Last year we planted a seed with Karen about an exhibition and so on Sunday 19 March in the Old Hall, a photography and art exhibition will be held from 9am to 3pm. It will be free entry and a great opportunity for everyone to meet with Karen and the 3 artists Cam and Helen Minto and Ursula Kelly.

Then on Friday 14 April will be the unveiling and dedication of the new cenotaph at Parklakes Drive. This has been some time in the planning and a wonderful addition to Bli Bli as now we will be able to attend an ANZAC Day service in Bli Bli. There is an honour board in the Old Hall which is dedicated to 49 soldiers from the Bli Bli area that served in WWII and so this will be a fitting way to remember them more specifically.

Then on Tuesday 28 March at the Bli Bli State School hall, a public consultation will be held in respect to the proposed Bli Bli Northern Village. The Community Association has been contacted to arrange for such a meeting in the community so that information can be provided as to the proposed development.

Progress is being made with the conversion of the area behind the Old Hall into an area for a group which has formed in respect to Community Gardens. Shortly this space will be converted to an open area for the establishment of raised garden beds for the group.

We would like to acknowledge the continued support of the Sunshine Coast Regional Council with the festival grant program whereby we received \$2000 towards the hosting of the Community Christmas Carols. Also, Cr Maria Suarez is very supportive in attending our monthly meeting and providing updates and useful information from Council. She attended our February meeting and gave us an update in respect to local issues.

Our next meeting is Tuesday 21st March which is scheduled for our AGM. All are welcome to attend in the Old Church from 7.30pm.

An update from your LOCAL STATE MEMBER, DAN PURDIE MEMBER FOR NINDERRY

It's hard to believe we're in March already – where has the year gone! Recently, I had the chance to congratulate the new school leaders at Bli Bli State School, and they were a very enthusiastic group of students. I know they will do a fantastic job, mentoring other students and being proud ambassadors for the school.

I also had an opportunity recently to visit Good Samaritan College, and check out all new facilities as they continue to go from strength to strength. We are very fortunate to have such high-quality schools in our local area.

Late last year, many residents provided their feedback as part of a survey in my newsletter. Thank you to everyone who took the time to have their say. The results have now been compiled, and the responses are not surprising.

You told me the top three issues that concern you are health (providing the hospital and health services we need); cost of living, and building better roads for our growing population. These are basic services that taxpayers deserve and expect, and why I raised it in Parliament recently.

If you don't follow me on socials and would like a copy of my speech, please let me know and I'll get it to you.

We're still waiting on answers from the Department of Transport and Main Roads in relation to the Bli Bli bridge. Late last year, TMR carried out further maintenance works to assess the condition of the bridge, and I asked the Minister for an update when Parliament returned last month. I hope to be able to share an update soon.

In other road-related news, I am looking forward to the results of the recent consultation around the Sunshine Motorway upgrades. In case you missed it, we secured nearly \$7million for this project, which includes planning for the duplication of the motorway, and upgrades to the interchange and Yandina Coolum Road. The preferred options include the duplication of a 10km section from David Low Way to Coolum, an active transport path from Pacific Paradise to Coolum, provision for south facing ramps at West Coolum, fauna fencing, improved lighting, and more.

This is one of the biggest infrastructure upgrades we've seen for many years, and I look forward to working with the community to ensure we get it right.

CONGRATULATIONS TO DIVISION 9 LOCAL MICHELE

Congratulations to Coolum local, Michele Lipner founder and coordinator of the local chapter of OzHarvest for being named Sunshine Coast Citizen of the Year. She has been honoured for her dedication to helping others, reducing food waste and advocating for vital behaviour change. Michele and her team of volunteers, collect more than 15,000 kilos of quality surplus food from 40 food donors and re-distribute it to 45 agencies to feed people in need every month.

BUSHCARE CALLING FOR MEMBERS

Do you love helping our environment and meeting likeminded people? Why not try BushCare – the local Whitecross Bushcare Group invites you to join their team of volunteers who look after their local bushland by removing environmental weeds and planting local natives. The group meetings on the second Wednesday of each month, from 8–10am at the entrance to the Whitecross Reserve at the end of Ringtail Place, Parklakes Estate. RECENT UPGRADES BLI BLI

Two stormwater pits on School Road and Fairview Close, Bli Bli have been replaced. This stormwater infrastructure that was at the end of its useful life and the new assets will provide another 50 years of use. A 63-metre-long stretch of existing concrete pathway was recently upgraded between 24 and 26 Tasol Street through to 1 Castle Green Court. The upgrade complements the recent lighting installation to further increase the safety of using this path both during the day and at night. Camp Flat Rd, Stage 4 upgrade is close to finalising engineering designs. Construction should occur next financial year.

IMPACT DEVELOPMENT APPLICATIONS

The service station application for Pacific Paradise has been refused by Council with the applicant indicating they will challenge the decision in the Planning & Environment Court. The Parklakes Central application is still requiring additional information prior to calls for submissions and assessment taking place.

ROAD LOOKUP

When I meet with the community, there are often a lot of requests for road crossings, repairs, infrastructure upgrades, speed reductions. It can sometimes be confusing which road falls under either the Council or Queensland Government authority. A handy tool for residents to find accurate road ownership information is <https://qldtraffic.qld.gov.au/lookup.html>. From there you should contact the relevant authority to lodge your request.

HEALTHY SUNSHINE COAST

Register now to take part in Council’s health and wellbeing program – Healthy Sunshine Coast, a range of low-cost, weekly activities around the region. It is all about creating a happier, healthier, more connected and resilient Sunshine Coast community. 2023 PRIORITIES

There are good reasons why people flocked to the Sunshine Coast – we are a lifestyle capital and we locals enjoy the world's most enviable way of life.

As 2023 begins, I reaffirm a pledge I made in my maiden speech in 2016: “to be Sunshine Coast’s man in Canberra and not Canberra’s man on the Sunshine Coast” - my loyalty lies at home and I’ll continue fighting for our region.

This year, I want to see tangible outcomes where I have secured funding, including: completion of the Maroochydore Rd / Mons Rd interchanges of the Bruce Highway (over \$300M); ramping up of Phase One of the North Coast Rail Line (over \$500M), and; starting work on the Mooloolah River Interchange on the Sunshine Motorway (over \$300M).

I’ll also be continuing my campaign for better rail services to the Coast, including full duplication of the North Coast Rail Line to Nambour (the \$5 million I secured for design work is yet to be matched by the Qld Labor Government); and a new line along the CAMCOS corridor to Maroochydore (the \$1.6 billion we secured is yet to be matched by the Qld Labor Government and funding has been postponed by the Federal Labor Government).

These aren't my only priorities of course, but they're the big ticket ones.



SPORTING AND PARA-SPORTING CHAMPIONS

It was great to recently meet another group of local sporting and para-sporting champions.

Thirty four (34) young sports stars were recognised in the latest round of Local Sporting Champions and Local Para Champions grants for 12-18 year olds.

I would particularly like to give a shoutout to:

- Finn Lawson from Bli Bli - Australian Schools Rugby Union tour to Japan; and
- Louis Fretwell from Maroochy River - Australian MX championship, QLD MX championship (Motocross).

I look forward to following their journey to the 2032 Games!

STRONGER COMMUNITIES PROGRAMME GRANTS NOW OPEN

Does your community group need some help?

I am inviting local not-for-profit community groups in Fairfax to submit their Expressions of Interest (EOI) for grants to help with small capital projects such as upgrades, fit-outs and equipment purchases.

The Stronger Communities Programme provides grants of \$2,500 to \$20,000 for projects that deliver social benefits and boost local community participation.

Grant recipients under the previous funding round included:

- Mudjimba Community Kindergarten & Pre-School (\$5,000 towards facilities upgrades); and
- Sunshine Coast Netball Association (\$9,770 towards a new first-aid, four-wheel buggy).

EOIs must be submitted HERE no later than 10 March for projects located in the Fairfax electorate. Up to 20 local projects will share in \$150,000.

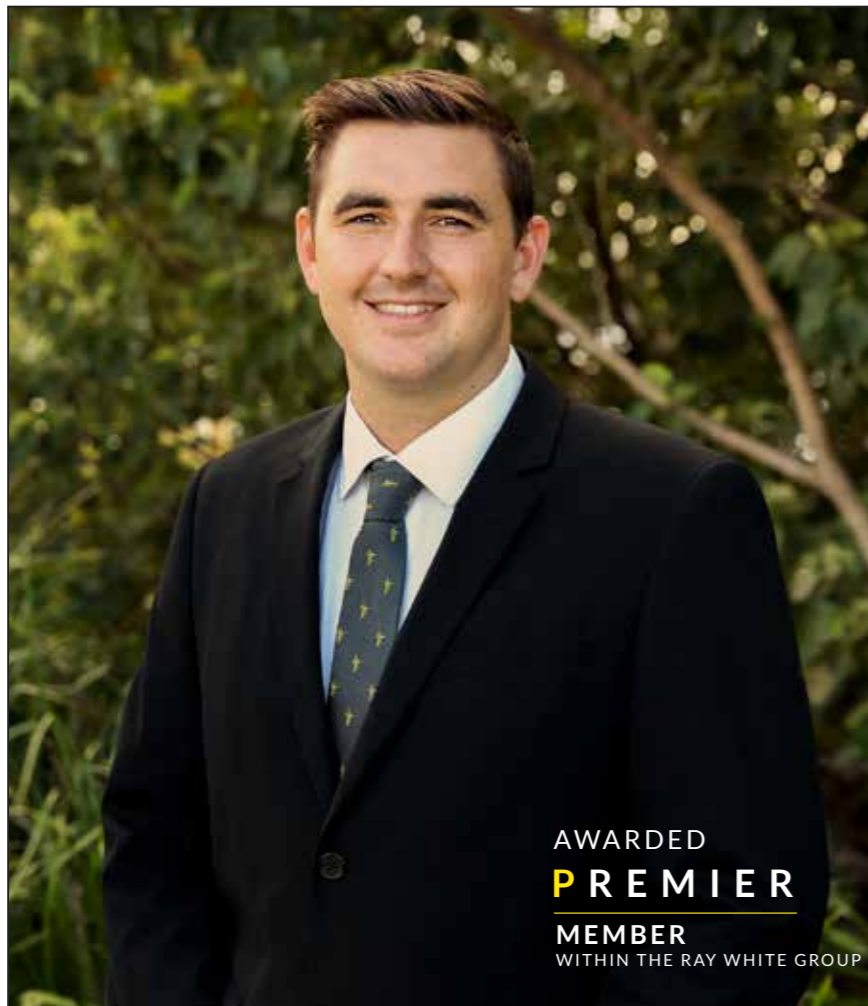

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

It seems time really does fly when you are having fun. This term has started with a flurry of activity with our clear focus on high expectations, engaging curriculum and positive culture.

It has been so rewarding to see just how settled our students are, including over 100 new students who have joined us in 2023. The children at our school continue to shine with their great behaviour and positive attitudes and work ethic. Already there is a buzz in the air, as we begin our preparations for our school musical in Term 2.

Our staff are currently heavily engaged in our strategic agenda, ensuring that our focus remains on giving our students the best possible opportunities to learn and play whilst in our care. Our five key areas continue to be:

We are working towards the implementation of Version 9 of the Australian Curriculum, commencing in 2024.
- Positive Culture 4 Learning** – We are reviewing our awards and rewards in 2023, to ensure that we are acknowledging the great achievements, both socially and academically that our children are showing. There are so many amazing, hard working students, who we want to recognise.
- Digital Futures** – This year we are focusing on our infrastructure upgrades and building a new learning platform that will be used across our school and our education system. Our students continue to lead the way, utilising a broad range of technologies to enhance and extend their learning.
- Diversity** – At Bli Bli State School we work hard to promote our firm belief that everyone belongs here. We work tirelessly to support staff and students to ensure that we treat all in our school community with respect, and provide an equitable approach to support all our diverse learners.

In Year 1, focusing on the global goal of *Quality Education*, students are learning to become book reviewers and will donate books to less fortunate communities in need of educational resources. In Year 3, students are undertaking a campaign to encourage the community to use fewer disposable plastics and thus working on the global goal of protecting sea turtles and all *Life Below Water*.

Finally, in Year 6, students are exploring the global goals holistically and contemplating what they would do if they were the president of the United Nations. These activities mark just the start of our journey and we are all very excited to keep supporting our students to become global citizens for the future.

We are now fortunate enough to have the services of a coach – Ryan Thomas. As outlined in Ryan's own article in the Spring edition of Bli Bli News, he has been involved in tennis coaching for over 15 years in Australia and overseas. Ryan and his family moved to the Sunshine Coast 18 months' ago from Melbourne. After visiting Bli Bli Tennis Club, Ryan realised that there is little tennis coaching available to the local community and there was an opportunity to change that. Bli Bli Tennis Club is run entirely by hard-working, not-so-young volunteers. We are looking for players in their 60's, male or female, to play in our social tennis group on Tuesday mornings 7am to 9am in summer (to beat the heat). We then relax afterwards with a coffee.

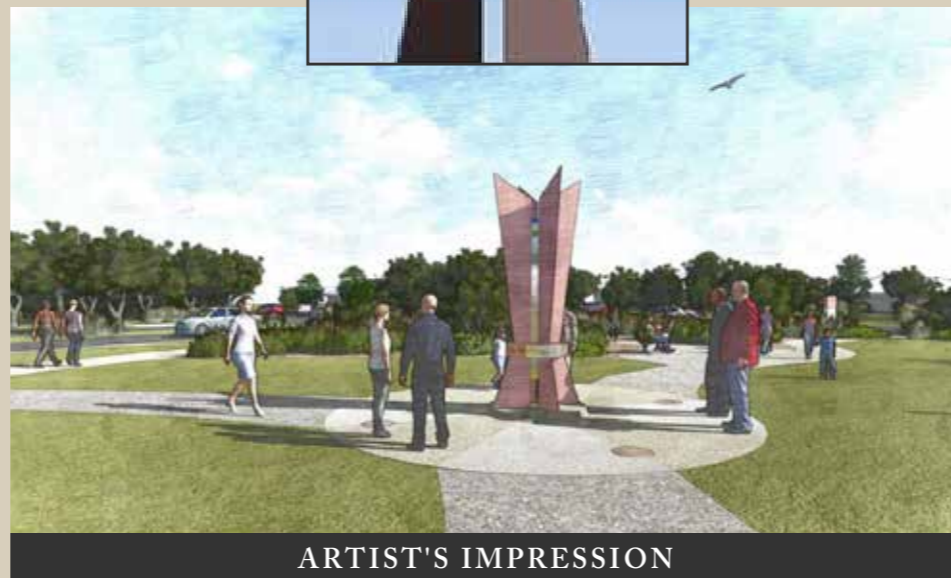

The better your sleep, the better you'll feel WHEN YOU'RE AWAKE!

Our principal chiropractor Richard has been traveling all around Australia for the past 18 months, due to his lovely wife Patrice playing in the hit musical Moulin Rouge! As such, he and his family have been with her every step of the way, all across this great country of ours.

Richard's greatest concern, however, has been the great variations in mattress quality that he and their family would have to stay in. While they would all take their pillows to every town, their mattresses would ultimately dictate the quality of sleep that they would all get. So, what do we recommend? Ultimately, you have to find what works for you. Some people fare much better with firmer mattresses, while others swear by softer mattresses that give way and conform better.

Sleep position can also dictate whether you are getting a proper rest and recovery period. Speak to any health practitioner, and they will tell you that sleeping on your stomach is the worst position for your neck and lower spine to sleep in, as you are constantly turned 90 degrees at the head and neck. This can cause long term stiffness in your neck muscles, but could also affect your general neck and spine movement, and leave you more prone to neck pain in general.

Back sleeping is the most ideal position, as it naturally allows your neck and spine to remain neutral, so individuals who prefer this position generally do best on a surface with a balanced feel. The largest concern for back sleepers spine-wise can be the lower back, which can suffer from pressure buildup if the hips and lumbar region do not receive enough support.

Side sleepers can often suffer if their mattress is too firm, or if their pillow is not thick enough.

Side sleeping places extra pressure on the hips and shoulders, which can quickly lead to soreness if there is insufficient cushioning. Usually, the best mattresses for side sleepers have thicker comfort

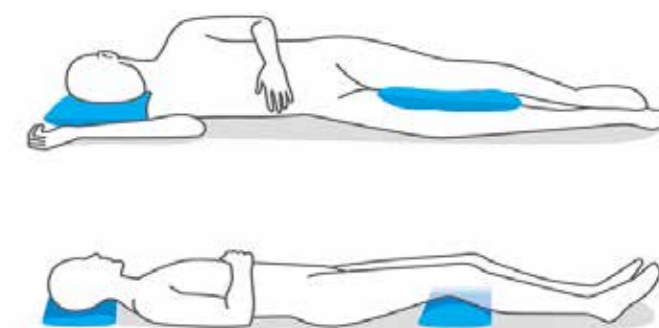
systems that allow wider parts of the body to sink in enough for the spine to remain straight. On the other hand, side posture can be better for people that suffer with conditions such as snoring or sleep apnea. The average person moves about 13 times an hour during sleep, but this can vary greatly between people(1).

How do you find the right mattress? As with a lot of other purchases, 'try before you buy' is the best answer. Don't be afraid to lay down in the mattress store or department store for a good 5-10 minutes per mattress, trying out all the different sleeping positions. Who knows, you may even make a friend or two!

If you have any other questions, please feel free to speak to your local chiropractor or health professional about the best way to get a better night's sleep. The better your sleep, the better you'll feel when you're awake!

Keep Your Pet HEARTWORM SAFE

No pet owner ever expects their dog to catch deadly heartworm, however there is a continuing increase in the number of cases being detected on the Sunshine Coast. Upsetingly, cases are being seen in dogs that have lived on the coast their entire lives. While North Queenslanders have been dealing with high levels of infected pets for many years, we've had a very low incidence of cases here. However, the area of high infection rates is encroaching - Bundaberg is the latest hotspot.

What is Heartworm?

Heartworm is transmitted by mosquitoes. After biting an infected animal, the tiny worms (Microfilaria) develop in the mosquito and are subsequently transferred to other animals. When bitten, heartworm larvae are injected into your pet's bloodstream, where they undergo several stages of development and make their way to the heart and lungs. These adult worms can reach sexual maturity in a few short months and will continue to reproduce for up to 7 years. They cause irreversible damage to the heart, lungs and arteries, and can affect your dog's health and quality of life long after the parasites are gone.

Prevention

We would like to remind everyone that prevention is by far the best option when it comes to heartworm.

There are many monthly preventative treatments available which are effective. However, they must be given on time and without fail as they only act against heartworm for a small part of their lifecycle - just after the developing worms enter your pet's skin following a mosquito bite.

The most effective method of protection is an annual injection - it is effective against heartworm through all of their life stages, including the adult worms.

An important reason for a preventative plan is that the treatment of clinical disease from these worms is complicated, lengthy and carries a level of risk as well. Treatment is also expensive and not always successful.

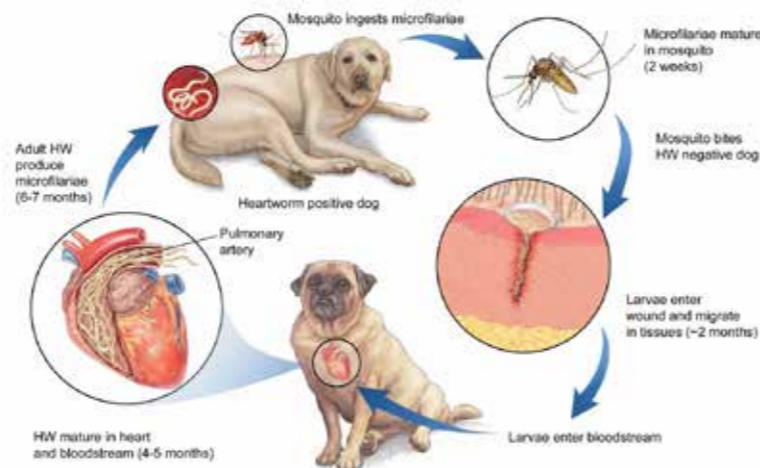
What to look for

In the early signs of the disease many dogs show little or no symptoms. It can easily go unnoticed.

- Mild persistent cough
- Limited energy
- Low appetite
- Weight loss

It is generally not until the disease has progressed further that symptoms are spotted - such as laboured breathing, constant fatigue, a swollen belly or pale gums. This may mean that by the time you are seeing symptoms, your pet has already acquired irreversible organ damage. Dogs with large numbers of heartworms can suddenly develop life-threatening blockages of blood flow within the heart.

If your pet hasn't been on continuous protection, testing for heartworm is recommended before starting any treatment. Talk to our Veterinary staff if you have any questions about what is the best option for your pet.

Floods over the Years

EPISODE 2

January 1st 1943. Flash flooding at its best. For 4 days the coast was the scene of violent storms with heavy rainfall. Average rainfall was approximately 6 inches, before the sky cleared.

Unfortunately, rapidly rising streams caused by the heaviest rainfall recorded for the month of December in some years, took the life of a resident in a flooded stream near Bli Bli. Although watercourses overflowed their banks and flooded many low-lying areas, little or no damage was reported apart from the sweeping away of soil from farm areas.

A violent storm with heavy lightening and crashes of thunder appeared over Maroochydore late on the Saturday afternoon. A flash struck the home of Mr. W. Ruegger, and another flash smashed a tree nearby. His wife was ironing with an electric iron downstairs. Suddenly, the lightning struck and she was thrown violently to the floor. Her husband, who was only a few feet away from his wife escaped injury. It was later confirmed the lightening had struck the radio aerial and progressed through a hole in the wall to demolish the radio and phone casing.

February 4th 1944. Conditions at Bli Bli were not good. Since Friday last the Bli Bli district has recorded something like eight inches of rain. The river has been in flood, carrying a fair amount of debris. Backed up against big tides and whipped by a strong south-easterly wind, the river has become exceedingly rough. While however, low-lying land along the river has been inundated, there are no reports of losses having been experienced. With the water receding great areas of mud and debris have been deposited on the river bank.

February 14th 1947. Again, the Maroochy River Tram Bridge is swept away in the district's cyclonic rain, cane and other agricultural areas have been inundated, rapid rises in the higher reaches of the Maroochy River have wrought havoc in numerous areas throughout Maroochy and Landsborough Shires.

Not for 24 years has Petrie Creek been so high, with the northern end of the main street at Nambour being submerged to about 18 inches. No fate as to the cane areas at Maroochy River and Bli Bli have been received, as they are all cut off. Most of the other areas traffic and tram bridges are known to be under water.

By 1950 communications were much improved and most of the flooding and cyclonic disturbances have been well documented. Below are just a few of these extraordinary events.

February 2nd 1951. The Maroochy in flood again. Reports have come in regarding relief parties and their magnificent work wading through chest high flood waters to deliver food rations to be made available to be delivered by boat, to the flood bound victims of the river areas.

In the most widespread flood of the river since the 1930s, Coulson's Wharf and boatshed were swept away. The water over the traffic bridge was at one point as high as 10 feet, the Coolum Road was at least 12 feet deep and several homes were in great danger, necessitating the removal of a number of families.

Mr. Coulson in an interview in 1996, pointed out a gumtree in the paddock and advised his 33-foot boat the "Irene" was dumped in the fork of the tree. He salvaged the steering wheel and attached it to the tree in memory of the boat.

The position on the river was growing and more serious every hour. It had been intended for Mr. Coulson's boats to assist in the removal of marooned families on the river. Eventually they bought in a large motor boat in charge of Mr. Percy Evans who removed many farmers and families to higher ground.

In 1954 the coast experienced some of the worst weather it had ever experienced. Two cyclones made landfall and left a trail of devastation, beaches were eroded, buildings and crops destroyed and took the life of one resident. In an interview with the newspaper, the then Chronicle, one resident, who in the 69 years he had lived on Buderim, claimed it was the worst cyclonic blow Buderim had ever endured.

The Bald Knob Hall was wrecked. Many houses were unroofed, including 50 at Caloundra. The outside toilets fared no better and most of the outside showers and toilet facilities were destroyed.

Between July 6-10 1973. On July 8 one 24-hour period recorded 384mm at Nambour, 349mm Woodford and 340mm at Mapleton. The 600 ton empty cargo vessel, the "Cherry Venture" was grounded on July 8th by gale force winds and wild seas that drove her onto Teewah Beach. She remained firmly grounded on the beach sands where she formed an established landmark. In 2004, her skeleton remains were dismantled and removed from the beach due to safety concerns.

On the 22nd June 1983. During this month flood waters inundated Petrie Creek, Cornmeal Creek and the Maroochy River causing widespread damage and flooding to buildings, roads,

bridges and farmland with the towns of Maroochydore and Nambour being the worst affected. Ray Grace had to be extracted via the roof when trapped by fast rising floodwaters.

February 21st and 22nd 1992: This was the closest flood to 1893 and gives thought to the Aboriginal prediction all those years ago of another in 100 years. This turned the coast into an inland lake with water covering hectares of land and the main transport was by boat.

Bli Bli was badly hit with this deluge. Water covered all approaches to the town centre, David Low Way to Pacific Paradise was covered in water. Standing in the middle of the Bli Bli Bridge the view was water from there to the motorway. Looking back to the castle, the old McBride's shop had water up to its floor boards (now the car wash).

With the coming of technology this flood and many other rain events since have been fully covered, the information is available from the Sunshine Coast Heritage Library and various newspaper records are available.

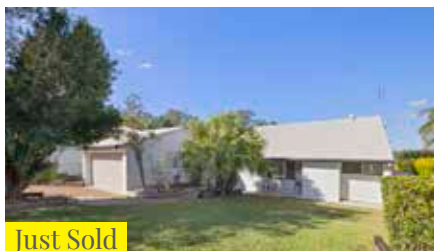
