An update from your LOCAL STATE MEMBER, DAN PURDIE MEMBER FOR NINDERRY

Where has the time gone? I can't believe we are just weeks away from welcoming in a new year. It was great to see so many locals enjoying the Carols, hosted once again by the Bli Bli Community Association, and supported by local business. Thanks to everyone involved for another fantastic event.

It was great to hear from our local police at the recent crime forum. The forum, hosted by the Community Association provided an opportunity for locals to hear first hand about the work the police are doing to keep our community safe, and how we can all assist, by ensuring we secure our property, and using important tools like Policelink to report non-urgent crime.

On another matter, I'd like to thank local residents and businesses who shared their feedback during the recent closure of the Bli Bli bridge.

I was just as surprised as everyone else when TMR announced plans to temporarily close one lane of the bridge to carry out repairs. What made the situation worse was the lack of communication before the work got underway.

Given the length and impact of the road closure, it's simply unacceptable that TMR didn't give more notice and the opportunity to provide feedback prior to work commencing. As a result a number of local businesses suffered significant financial losses, and the inconvenience to commuters and residents has been widespread.

While I appreciate the necessity of the work, the timing could have been better, and the lack of consultation was very disappointing.

It's simply not good enough, and I've written to the Minister and asked him to look at financial compensation for those affected businesses.

In the meantime, I will continue to advocate for better longterm solutions to ensure our road infrastructure is fit for purpose and supports the needs of our growing population.

FREE TREE DAY

I'll be hosting free tree giveaway days from 9am to 11am at at Muller Park, Bli Bli on Friday, December 8. Come down, have a chat and take home two native trees for your garden (rates notice required). Otherwise, you can request a street tree for your verge and green up your neighbourhood.

ROAD UPGRADE

The upgrade along Camp Flat Road, Bli Bli will resume from the previous section of Camp Flat Road completed in 2021 and will also include the Whitecross Road intersection. The upgrade to this section will result in improved safety outcomes for the community. Additional upgrades to the remainder of Camp Flat Rd will continue over future years. Please allow extra travel time during the construction phase. Thank you for your understanding.

STORMWATER UPGRADE

Earlier this year, the stormwater pit at Lefoes Road, Bli Bli, was upgraded. Stormwater infrastructure is Council's largest asset to maintain. While, stormwater pipes and pits are typically hidden, they are vitally important when managing water runoff.

HEALTHY WATERWAYS

In 2024, you can expect to see some work to in Princess Drive Park to ensure that water flow is managed across the park while still allowing space for our community to enjoy. The work will also ensure that the water from the park is of a quality to keep the nearby Petrie Creek Catchment waterways healthy. Thank-you for your patience while work takes place.

The Working Group keeps busy with small jobs for the community. They constructed an awning which covers the northern doors of our building.




The IT Group is very active and keeps up to date with the latest technology changes. The Photographic Group recently visited the Ginger Factory and returned with some excellent shots.



PRINCIPAL'S PONDERINGS

Our College turned five this year and continued to grow, change and develop. We have seen significant building works completed, new curriculum offerings commenced and an explosion of opportunities in the Arts and Sporting areas. GOOD SAMS BREAKFAST CLUB





Merry Christmas FROM BLI BLI VET

With Christmas just around the corner, many of us are preparing for trips away or time at home with our families during the holidays. This is a busy time of year for everyone, and it is very easy to lose track of the preventative healthcare needs of our furry friends.

Although paralysis tick season is on the wind down, these pesky parasites are a dangerous threat all year round in our area. We therefore recommend being vigilant and keeping tick prevention up to date in all pets, even those who spend most of their time indoors. There are many highly effective tick preventatives on the market, however daily tick searches are still recommended for early detection.

Symptoms or tick paralysis include but are not limited to:

- Loss of balance
- Wobbliness in hind legs
- Laboured breathing, increased respiratory rate, or panting
- Vomiting, gagging or regurgitation
- Excessive drooling
- Inability to blink

If you find a tick on your pet, you should have them checked out immediately even if they are not displaying any symptoms.

Trips away for us sometimes means placing our pets in to boarding facilities. Be sure to check in advance that vaccinations are up to date, as most boarding facilities will not accept unvaccinated pets or those who are overdue their vaccines. Don't leave vaccination boosters to the last minute!

Another very important part of the holiday season is FOOD! While many of us love to indulge in delicious treats over Christmas, many of the foods that we eat are highly toxic to our pets. Things like grapes and raisins (found in fruitcakes and fruit mince pies), chocolate, alcohol and fatty, salty meats such as ham can be harmful or even fatal to our pets. Deviations from their regular diet can sometimes cause upset tummies in our pets, even if the foods given are not toxic. Many of us want to spoil our pets over the holiday season! However, we must exercise caution in order to avoid the need for medical intervention over the holiday period. No body wants to make a trip to the vet on Christmas Day!

Finally, it is important to note that opening hours and supply chains often vary during the holiday period. For those pets needing regular medication, be sure to get in touch and stock up before holiday closures.

For the pioneers of a large section of this district, and indeed for many people in more recent times, the Maroochy River was a lifeline which served the farming community for almost 80 years. From the earliest days of settlement, boats of all sizes moved up and down this waterway, between Yandina and Maroochydore, serving the farms with food, provisions and the other necessities of life as well as mail.

The river also made possible the development of the districts first industry -- sawmilling. Logs from the forests were rafted down the Maroochy to Maroochydore, where they were milled and then transported by ship to Brisbane.

With no road links to the coast, Yandina was the railhead and the corridor for the river boats, which made the daily 18 mile run to Cotton Tree.

As far back as the 1880's, steamships from Brisbane sailed through the river mouth and berthed at Maroochydore and were used to transport timber, produce and passengers to the city.

One of the best known rivermen was the late Mr. William John Coulson, who was born in 1877 near Durham, England. He first ran a small boat on the Maroochy River in 1908.

In January of the following year he obtained a waterman's licence to operate the motorboat "Kate", which was licensed to carry 10 passengers. In 1910 Mr. Coulson operated the 20 passener "Sis" and was granted a contract to deliver mail two days a week from Yandina to Bli Bli via Coolum Creek for 35 pounds (\$70 a year).

For many years, all Coolum mail was delivered by boat to a wharf up Coolum Creek and the letters were then taken by horse and cart to Coolum.

Mr. Coulson was joined by a partner and they traded as Coulson and Albin until 1941. After the boats "Sis" and "Kate", Mr. Coulson ran "Irene" and "Ariel" each 33 feet long and licensed to carry 40 passengers.

These boats were fully laden on public holidays with passengers travelling from Yandina to Cotton Tree for a picnic lunch and return.

Launch master over a long period was Roland Gill. Before his death in 1950, Mr. Coulson had a boat specially built with shallow draft to cope with the silting of the river.

His son Lionel then took over the business. In 1951, Lionel Coulson was making calls at 60 wharves. During an interview in that year, Mr. Coulson said in 1951 floods floods in the river had been the worst in his memory. They swept away the sheds at the Yandina wharf and carried away one of his boats into a canefield, where it was wrecked. Half the boat was up a 30 foot gum tree and he later nailed the steering wheel to the trunk of the tree as a reminder of this momentous event.

The water rose more than one and a half metres higher than the highest mark pegged by Mr. Coulson's father during his lifetime on the river.

Lionel Coulson, now a farmer at Yandina, carried on the boat run until 1954. After that, the business changed hands, several times but with the building of better roads and farmers shifting their homes away from the river to roads, the boat business waned and finally ended.

Today there is only one big launch on the Maroochy - the "Kilkie", which makes regular pleasure trips between Maroochydore and Dunethim Rock.

Until a few years ago the "Kilkie" filled another important role, when it transported school children from farms on the north shore of the river to the Bradman Avenue jetty from where they were taken by road to the Maroochydore Primary and High Schools.


Years ago, before they had road access to their properties, a number of north shore farmers in the Bli Bli-Maroochydore area, owned motor cars.


Where houses now stand in Bradman Avenue, there were tin sheds, used as garages for the farmer's cars. When they wanted to go on an outing, the families would hop in their small boats and make for Bradman Avenue, where they would tie up and then set off in their cars.

Most the above came from the "75 years in a day - Chronicle Territory" published a number of years ago in a memorial to the Nambour Chronicle, no longer in existence. As will be realized a lot has changed even since this was published and this article is only printed as a tribute to these men and their dedication to the river.
